### **Bedfordshire Girls Represent**

Becky Reed and Kayleigh Jean will be representing England at the Indoor Nets in August, in New Zealand.

Internationally, Nets/Indoor Netball is governed by the World Indoor Netball Association (WINA). WINA organise and run a series annual international tournaments.

In October 2015 England Netball took gold at the Nets World Championships in Australia. Four teams went to the Aged World Championships, and the U18 ladies squad became World Champions, beating South Africa 51- 47 in the final. They also became the first ever England team to beat Australia in Nets, doing so three times across the competition!



England Nets are looking to build on their success in Australia last year as



they travel to New Zealand to compete in the World Indoor Netball World Cup in August.

Becky and Kayleigh are working hard to secure funding, so they have a fun mixed tournament on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> June, followed by a Race night.

11 CAPS for Scotland and represented Scotland at Netball Europe 2016 in Newcastle. At the tournament Scotland were third in the championship section of the tournament.

It was the first time that all nine full members of Netball Europe participated in this annual event. England, Scotland, Northern Ireland and Wales competed in the Performance section and England once again took first place, with Wales winning silver and Scotland bronze. Beth Goodwin from Scotland was voted player of the tournament.

Netball Scotland is responsible for promoting, organising and developing netball inScotland from 'grass roots' to elite level, with more than 2,900 registered members andanestimated20,000participantsinScottishschools.

Netball Scotland is currently expanding their membership base beyond eight traditional areas to regions such as the Scottish Highlands, the Borders and the Islands, based upon

increased government funding. To ensure a quality participation environment, education and training courses

are conducted with support for members through insurance cover and child protection expertise. Netball Scotland also provides opportunities for talented athletes, coaches and umpires on the world stage based upon a strong presence in international netball.

## Sport England Strategy 2017-21

Sport England have released their new strategy 'Towards an Active Nation' for the next four year cycle.

The strategy details seven new investment programmes. The first of which, Tackling Inactivity, focuses on engaging the inactive (as opposed to those who already play sport or are active), particularly those from underrepresented groups such as women and older people. Other programmes include Supporting sport's core market (how to best service those already involved in sport) and Taking sport into the mass market – which encourages new innovations. Also included are Children and young people (5+ instead of 14+ previously), Volunteering, Talent and Facilities.

Key features of the new strategy are:

#### Dedicated funding to get children and young INFLUENCES ON CHILDREN ON A TYPICAL DAY

- Dedicated funding to get children and young people active from the age of five, including a new fund for family based activities and offering training to at least two teachers in every secondary school in England to help them better meet the needs of all children, irrespective of their level of sporting ability
- Working with the sport sector to put customers at the heart of everything they do, and using the principles of behaviour change to inform their work
- Piloting new ways of working locally by investing in up to 10 places in England – a mix of urban and rural areas
- Investing up to £30m in a new volunteering strategy, enabling more people to get the benefits of volunteering and attracting a new, more diverse range of volunteers
