We have experienced two years like no other, but we survived and thanks to the combined efforts of volunteers and England Netball employees working in tandem netball in the East Region is alive and kicking and as vibrant and exciting as ever. Over the last 12 months there has been a strong focus on rebuilding the game to prepandemic levels, which as you can see from this report was a very successful process, so my thanks and congratulations to everyone for their passion, energy and commitment, it's what make the East Netball Family such an exceptional group of people.

Due to the pandemic England Netball rightly chose to cancel the Goalden Globes event but in the East we wanted to recognise and celebrate our volunteers working in a netball setting and our netballers working in the emergency services. We received over 200 nominations across all categories for our Pride of the East Lockdown Legends Awards.

Every nominees was awarded a special `Netball East Lockdown Legend pin badge designed by Betty Brocklesby Sum and special thanks to Saracens Mavericks who provided all design competition entrants with the opportunity to be a ball girl at their VNSL match v Loughborough Lightening. A full list of all Lockdown Legends is included in the report so, again, a big thank you and congratulations to you all and my thanks to the Pride of the East project team led by Lucy Hodges.

This year England Netball have introduced the One Awards as a successor to the Goalden Globes and in the East we received a record 105 nominations across 10 categories (53 for the 2020 Goalden Globes) so my best wishes to all the nominees and thanks to the panel of East Honorary Life Member who reviewed every nomination and selected winners in each category. The Regional One Awards will be held on 3 July 2022 at the Bar Hill Hotel in Cambridgeshire.

I would like say a big thank you to my colleagues on the Regional Management Board and our team

of County Chairs who have been at the forefront of rebuilding netball in the East over the last 24 months with a special mention to Cheryl Danson, who stood down as Governance lead for the Region at last years AGM, to Lucy Hodges who stood down as Regional Volunteer lead due to work commitment and Olivia Petherick who stood down as Chair of Cambridgeshire Netball Association after many years distinguished service.

However, I want to reserve the biggest thank you to Jan Burke who has stood down from her regional duties after many years of exemplary service as a member of the Regional Management Board, Chair of the Competition Technical Support Group, and ultimately as organiser in chief of the Regional Schools event. Thank you Jan for your brilliant contribution to Netball in the East (and nationally), you will be missed.

I want to finish by looking forward to what I believe will be an exciting future for the sport with England Netball's new 10 year strategy for the sport accompanied by five years funding from Sport England. The RMB is suggesting some changes to the Constitution so that the East can play its part in growing a more expansive and inclusive sport. It is a big challenge but not beyond our collective capabilities. In essence our challenge is to grow Netball in the East and to make it more inclusive to do that we need to:

- Understand the needs and expectations of our members and wider audiences.
- 2. Ensure the governance of our organisations is of a high standard.
- 3. Build a `Team East` a community of volunteers, England Netball employees and
- Saracens Mavericks personnel working collaboratively to create and deliver a menu of exciting netball opportunities that provide extraordinary experiences for the netball family in the East Region.





This will require a transformation of culture by working as one so over the next 12 months there will be a strong emphasis of `people and culture` to harness the passion, energy and expertise which will enable us to be more collaborative and less insular in our approach. We will also, use our voice to lobby and influence England Netball nationally develop processes and systems that support this approach. So, we want to invest more time and thought on 'how' we work together rather than focusing solely on 'what' we do together.

Every cloud has a silver lining and the pandemic has clearly demonstrated the power of working together as one so we need to take that learning a build a progressive, positive, inclusive and exciting future for Netball in the region.

COMPETITION

East region competition report 2021/22 season

EAST REGION SCHOOLS

40 teams entered the regional schools' tournament this year representing 24 Schools across the seven counties:

- Cambs: Stephen Perse, Hills Road, The Perse
- Essex: Brentwood, Saffron Walden County High, Fitzwimarc
- Herts: Berkhamsted, St Albans High School, Broxbourne, Sandringham, Herts & Essex

Semi-finalists were as follows:

- **U19**: St Albans, Stephen Perse, Berkhamsted and Bedford Girls
- U16: Sandringham, Brentwood, Broxbourne and The Perse
- U14: Brentwood, Herts & Essex, Saffron Walden County High and Berkhamsted

The finalists who went on to represent the East at National Schools:

- U19: 1st Berkhamsted; 2nd St Albans
- U16: 1st Brentwood; 2nd Perse
- U14: 1st Brentwood; 2nd Berkhamsted

Positive feedback: Strong communication in advance and on the day; schools appreciated the replacement of passport age check with headmasters' letter.





Negative feedback: The new umpiring schedule meant some schools had three teams playing at the same time and only one coach; parents and some schools were unhappy that spectators were not allowed this year due to COVID.

Review for future tournaments: The possibility of introducing live streaming and digitising results in future tournaments has been discussed; Look to reduce costs/expenses; and discuss the umpiring schedule.

We would like to say a special thank you to Jan Burke who has step down as Regional Schools Lead, Jan has held this role for many years and has done a fantastic job, and she will be greatly missed by everyone on the Competitions TSG.

EAST REGION YOUTH LEAGUE

This season we had 17 U14 teams and 21 U16 teams, due to COVID we decided not to run an entry tournament and accept all teams in three divisions in each age group. This meant a greater number of team were able to experience Regional netball. During the season some fixtures were affected by COVID but fortunately we were able to rearrange these and complete the season.

We were really pleased ERYL was able to take place and it was lovely to see so meant talented athletes being able to compete at a high level. We wish our winners and runners up good luck in the National finals.




EAST OFFICIATING PASSES

REGIONAL PARTICIPATION

The team of NDOs and NDCCs have had a great year of re-establishing many of the programmes that were offered pre pandemic as well as setting up some new programmes across the Region.

We have been consulting with the team, wider organisation, and partners to refresh our Partnership Network Team (PNT) structures and roles to realign to the new Adventure Strategy. Following this consultation, we are excited to share some changes that will be implemented from 1st July.

TEAM AND JOB TITLES

- Our new team name is: Partnerships & Delivery Team
- The Head new job title is: Head of Partnerships & Delivery
- The PM new title is: Partnerships & Delivery Manager
- Regional Coordinators new title: Regional Officer
- Regional Officers will report into the Partnership and Delivery Manager

In addition to the above we are also introducing a 5th Partnership Manager (Partnership and Delivery Manager) and updating the geographical territories, each PM will transition to these in quarter 2 exact date TBC. The new structure sees no change for LSE and East and Philippa Hicks will remain as the PM for this area. East Midlands and Yorkshire will now be linked, and we are currently recruiting a new PM for this patch.

There has been no change to the NDO/NDCC structure and each County still has a England Netball member of staff to support the County, Leagues and Members. There has however been an update to the NDO and NDCC job description to reflect the adventure strategy over the next 10 years.





NATIONAL ACHIEVEMENTS FROM THE YEAR

- We have now reached a new record number for members with over 108,250 people returning to a netball court. This exceeds the previous record set during the 2018/19 year, in between the Commonwealth Games and the Netball World Cup in Liverpool, where we had 107,500 members.
- On Wednesday 1st June we launched a brand-new England Netball podcast called Courtside. The
 podcast, which will be a series of six episodes, will take us on a journey to the Commonwealth Games in
 Birmingham and will feature some famous voices from the Roses camp
- From 30th May EN will be pitching Bee Netball to clubs to excite, inspire and to motivate them about the evolution of the programme, any club wishing to deliver Bee Netball can join one of the welcome virtual sessions.
- The Vitality Roses will be heading out for a training camp in South Africa next month before the Commonwealth Games team come together in Nottingham and then head into the Games village. After the Games, the Roses will be preparing for the 2023 Netball World Cup in South Africa with fixtures against highly ranked teams at home and abroad.
- Relaunch of the One Awards (formally Goalden Globes) with an online application process and new branding.
- EN have been benchmarked as a C grading in the recent Race Representation Index (carried out by sporting equals) ended 6/26 form the organisation that took part.
- EN have supported a number of campaigns as part of Race Equality Week staff used social media channels to support #ActionNotJustWords and #MyNamels.
- New partnerships established with Well HQ and EMMNA.
- Extension of partnerships with Nike and Vitality.
- EN published Diversity and Belonging report.
- New EN 10-year adventure strategy officially launched on 25th November 2021.
- New NE branding officially launched on 25th November 2021.
- VNC and national forums have continued to be offered to members, to support them with their return to court. These include league, clubs, coaches, officials, and facilities.

Although we moved towards September 2021 and the start of a new season with enthusiasm and high expectations, there was still a certain amount of nervousness to overcome after the experiences of the previous 18 months.

As things started to get back to some normality, I am pleased to say that our return to the courts back in January showed 88% membership return, 98% of Clubs returning and 100% Leagues up and running. Our membership figures are now showing total of 3,569 members. Walking Netball and Back to Netball continue to flourish and our NDO reports 295 new participants on these programmes.

Although all 4 leagues began their competitions in September, Covid still impacted and a higher number of games were affected.

However, netball has continued and as we come to the end of our season, our Leagues finish with their cup finals, and all have plans in place now for the summer and the forthcoming season

The County, as part of our Re-ignite Netball Package to members supported all teams entering their respective Leagues by paying 50% of their league entry fees; arranging a special separate 'live' presentation of our County Awards, although we had to delay this and an afternoon tea and prosecco event was eventually held in November. The last item on our package, the Netball Festival, has been held over and now planned for September 2022 entitled a celebration of netball.

One highlight of the season was the successful Academy Invitation Tournament held on 30 April, in Bedford, 11 counties from Bedfordshire, Berkshire, Cambridgeshire, Cheshire, East Essex, Hertfordshire Manchester, Norfolk, North Bucks, Surrey and Sussex sent squads in the U13 and U15 age groups. All the players who took part are in their respective County Academies.

Thanks must be given to our Performance Academy Group, despite their still being uncertainty encountered our Academies have continued to operate well and delivery of their planned programme completed.

Year 1 of our Coach Education programme ended in May and Year 2 is now being planned. Next Generation coaching workshops are now being advertised.

Going forward and looking ahead to the next season, it is great to see the continued growth of netball and I am sure whatever challenges come our way, our dedicated netball volunteers will see us through.

Now looking back over the past 12 months I am again proud of all those across Bedfordshire who have worked so hard in the background within the County and Leagues to ensure that netball has really returned to the County.


Hertfordshire

The reduction in affiliated members, coupled with the 30% discount offered to members who affiliated before 30 September 2020 as part of the #riseagain movement, was countered with a further reduction in expenditure due to COVID restrictions.

During such challenging times, the RMB looked at other areas in which we could support our members; we purchased 250 licences at a cost of £1,500 for Mental Health Awareness Training for Sport & Physical Activity. The uptake was good.

In September 2020, the region and its counties offered a support fund for affiliations for members experiencing financial difficulty. This member support fund is still in place, and we continue to explore avenues in order to assist those members in need.

In the year to 31 August 2022, the region reduced its membership fees to £nil to further 'give back' and help alleviate the financial pressures many of our members have faced.

The region continues to provide grant assistance for coaches and tutors who wish to attend the UKCC and assessor courses.

The position shown in the accounts remains healthy and the association has, in my opinion, sufficient resources to continue to meet the challenges which lie ahead.
